Coppola, Lasseter, vintners coax \$2 million in bids in Geyserville

rancis Ford Coppola, the Acade my Award-winning director, set the stage for the premiere of Sonoma Paradiso, the wine auction formerly known as Imagine that raised \$2 million Saturday.

Coppola supplied a new venue — his Alexander Valley winery Rosso & Bianco, formerly known as Chateau Souverain, in Geyserville.

More than 400 people came to sip and bid under the white tent at the charity auction, now in its fourth year. While early results indicate the contributions fell short of last year's take of \$2.5 million, the amount is still second in California only to that of Auction Napa Valley, which raised \$7.48 million in June.

Coppola, who has his own winerv in the Napa Valley, said he's a "proud newcomer" to Sonoma County. "I was in Buenos Aires 36 hours ago working on a film. Yes, I'm still a filmmaker. I'm very proud to be part of Sonoma County's winegrowing tradition. In the near future it will be the proud equal of Napa Valley."

While a single-prop airplane and a new Maserati drew the highest bids, the final impromptu lot was the most

Vintner Jess Jackson, introducing the lot, coaxed paddle-holders to help



organizers reach \$2 million when they were \$49,500 shy. He took the stage, along with Coppola and John Lasseter, a vintner who doubles as the chief creative officer of Disney and Pixar Animation Studios. Jackson said the lot featured a magnum signed by each and a dinner cooked by each.

Shirlene Elkins, who bought the lot with three others, is a trustee on the board of the Naples Winter Wine Festival, which is the biggest money-raising wine auction in the world.

She said that Jackson and his wife, Barbara Banke, have "always been very supportive of the Naples auction"
